Hurricane season officially ended on November 30th and thankfully we were spared yet another year. I thank everyone for their cooperation following the rules and By-Laws this season.

As most of you know, the Clubhouse is open and operational. There are a few things left to be done but we are close to 100% completion.

We have had some problems with garbage over the last few weeks as seen in the pictures below.



It seems after hours when the staff is gone, people are hauling their trash to the garbage truck and either piling it up or setting it on the ground front of the truck. Nine times out of ten the animals have gotten to it by the morning and have made quite the mess leaving needles, diapers, sanitary products and many other hazardous items on the ground for our staff and volunteers to clean the following morning.

Garbage is picked up curbside three times a week and I ask that you please hold your items for pick-up day. If you are leaving on a weekend and need someone to take your trash can up from the road for you we would be happy to do so. Just send the office an email or call and we will arrange it for you. There are many times large debris items get left down at the storage area (such as construction debris). The trash truck is not meant for such items and these must be hauled away by yourself or the contractor completing the work. I am working on getting an open top dumpster here over the next few weeks for bulk items. We will do this a few times a year.


BOCCE by Mary Dombro and Luxy LeClair

THE OSPREY

First to greet us on our return to the beach was the osprey, wings spread soaring high overhead wearing the dark eye stripe of a bandit. A single

loud, shill chirping whistle *teeeeaaa* heard from overhead. The osprey ever vigilant; hovers above the water, patrolling for fish hidden below.

Even though found across continental United States, there is something quintessentially Floridian about the Osprey where it is a year-round resident. Mostly solitary and weighing about three pounds, Osprey, also called sea hawk, fish hawk or river hawk, perch and nest on isolated trees, poles and towers. Besides fish, osprey eat rodents, hares, reptiles and other birds.

They mate for life and begin breeding when they are 3 to 5 years old. The large, rangy hawks do well around humans and have rebounded in numbers following the ban of the pesticide DDT.

Ospreys are unusual among hawks in possessing a reversible outer toe that allows them to grasp with two toes in front and two behind. Barbed pads on the soles of the birds' feet help them grip slippery fish. When flying with prey, an Osprey lines up its catch head first for less wind resistance, kind of like a plane carrying a missile.

Studies have shown Osprey are excellent anglers, spending about 12 minutes catching fish on at least 1 in every 4 dives.

The name osprey is a Medieval Latin phrase for "bird of prey." The oldest known osprey was at least 25 years old and lived in Virginia, banded in 1973 and found in 1998.

THE MANTA RAY

In early November a group of us were privileged to witness a large flattened diamond shaped creature off the shore of our beach. A distant relative of the shark, it was a Manta Ray.

Manta Rays are sometimes called a devil ray because their pectoral fins form broad pointed 'wings' looking like a devil's horns. Mantas feed using their head fins to funnel plankton, fish, shrimp and other small marine creatures into their wide mouth.

THE NATURE OF OCEAN RESORTS by Linda Smolarek

Unlike sharks, Manta Rays do not have teeth and instead sieve food particles out of the water using rows of tiny plates (gills) in their mouths.

Manta Rays have been noted to swim in circles, individuals "stack" behind one another while feeding. The one in front gets the most but they switch places as they swim so each gets a turn in the leader position.

They rest and splash on or about the surface, alone, in pairs or groups moving through the water column as if they are flying. Young develop in the mother's body and give birth to live offspring, producing one pup per year. Manta Rays frequent warm waters along continents and islands.

Manta Rays, just like their stingray cousins, have a long whip like tail, but there's nothing to worry about. They DON'T HAVE a poisonous tail stinger that many of their relatives have. Manta rays CANNOT hurt you. Manta rays are harmless to humans. Steve Irwin was killed by a stingray barb. And Manta rays teeth are not sharp enough to tear flesh and they rely on their large size to avoid predators.

A manta ray moves at a speed of 14 kph but can reach burst of up to 35 kph. Research has shown mantas have huge brains, the biggest of any fish with especially developed areas for learning, problem solving and communication. The giant rays are playful, curious and might even recognize themselves in mirrors, a sign of self-awareness, true of elephants, dolphins and people too. It is thought that they can live between 40 to 50 years but more information is needed to establish their exact longevity.

BACI TRATTORIA'S website describes the bistro as a funky Italian food experience and it is! I have had the Lemon Ricotta pancakes, Poached Eggs over fried green tomatoes, Shrimp over polenta, and omelets. All were delicious and freshly cooked to order. The inside of BACI is very small but they now have delightful outside dining area in a covered patio. The new restaurant next door, PRIMA Pizza and Pasta, shares the outside dining area at certain times of the day. Tucked into a small shopping area, BACI is a little hidden gem for sure.

Other 14th Avenue restaurants we have tried are Taco Dive, Post & Vine, Southern Social, Saigon Sushi, Sean Ryan's, Vero Prime, and the Italian Kitchen. For more new restaurant ideas, I highly recommend the website Vero Beach Foodie. It's free to sign up and postings frequently have photos.

THE JOY OF READING by Nancy Wilder



I am writing this on December 3rd, on Cape Cod Ma. It's a snowy, cold day and I just put the tree up. This is my kind of reading day. A couple of years ago I read "Olive Kitteridge" by Elizabeth Strout. The location is a small town in Maine and the author writes beautifully of the Maine seacoast and the local people. Olive and her experiences remind me of "Eleanor Oliphant is Completely Fine", the same odd but admirable lead character type. It was a bestseller (and a movie) and now she's back again. Aptly named "Olive

Again", the book is a great read. The stories follow Olive as she ages. From living alone (the good and the bad), dealing with friends and family and even assisted living, Olive grows on you. Theres a particularly poignant passage where Olive curls up with a transistor radio pressed against her ear, trying to block out the world with a stranger's voice. And then of course, the "poopy pants" will have you smiling. You will enjoy the books.

I belong to a book group on the Cape also. This month I want to share our book with Ocean Resorts. "An Episode of Sparrows", by Rumer Godden, is a hidden gem. Published in 1955, the author has written a wonderful book. The setting is post World War Two London. Two street tough kids want to build a garden in a town piled with bomb debris. As there are no public gardens and the children are not "allowed" to play in private gardens, Lovejoy and friend, Tip, plot how to plant a secret garden. Abandoned by her mother, being fostered by a colorful couple with their own problems, Lovejoy just wants to plant beautiful flowers.





Now this is more of a preview, but I'm reading "The Dutch House" by Ann Patchett, and I've been pulled in very quickly. A huge famous old house is the center backdrop of the novel. Two siblings (likable right away), motherless, live with their wealthy father and loving house staff. But then, a soon to be stepmother appears with her two young children. The book spans many generations and I'm anxious to see how this develops. Ann Patchett is a well known author and I have always enjoyed her books.
