

Ocean Resorts Celebrates our Nonagenarians: Frances Eleanor Ford

Editor's Note: I was lucky enough to speak with Frances last week before she died, asking her permission to do a Nonagenarian article since she had turned 90 in October, 2018. Her daughter, Diane, worked with Frances on answering my written interview questions. Unfortunately, the newsletter was not published before Frances passed away but Diane agreed that we should still run the article in this issue.

Frances Eleanor (Holden) Ford was born on October 17, 1928 in Stevensville, MD. She graduated from Stevensville High School in 1945. During that time period they only had eleven grades and since she had an October birthday, she graduated at the age of 16. Frances worked several months in Washington DC at the FBI during World War II. She then went to work at the original Fisherman's Inn Restaurant where she met her future husband, Charles Owen Ford III. Charles was a charter boat captain on the Chesapeake Bay and Frances went to work on the boat with him after raising their children.

Charles and Frances married on February 8, 1949 in the Stevensville United Methodist Church Kent Island, Maryland and were married for 63 years until Charles' passing in November, 2012. They had two children, Diane Frances (Ford) Arthurs, who lives with her husband, Jeff, in Uhrichsville, Ohio, and Dennis Charles Ford, deceased in 2014.



Ocean Resorts was always a special place for Charles and Frances. They started coming here in 1984 with Lois and Robert Horney, also from Maryland. "Miss Lois" was Frances' best friend from high school. Charles and Frances retired to Ocean Resorts in 1990. They loved the warm weather but mostly loved the people. They had many good friends, past and present, and enjoyed the many parties and crab feasts, with crabs caught and steamed by Charles.




The Joy of Reading by Nancy Wilder



I went up north for a few weeks over the holidays. It was great to see the family, but Cape Cod is grey and cold this time of year. Fortunately, I had a book assigned to read from my book group. So on a raw, rainy day at home, I curled up on the couch to start “**A Man Called Ove**” by Frederik Blackman. I think I started this book a year or so ago, but I just could not get into it. Well....things change. I read, I smiled and I literally wept. The location is Sweden, the main character a grumpy widower (some say he’s more than grumpy). He is a man with little to say and an exaggerated view of rules and the importance of doing things “the right way”. Now throw in some disorganized new neighbors, a cat with half a tail and a failing old friend. The characters are well developed and very likable. And, I just found out its a movie! I’m often hesitant to see “the movie” as I have this well developed vision of the characters and the locale, but I may check this film out.

“**Educated**” by Tara Westover is nonfiction. I glanced through the book in a bookstore while visiting relatives in Ireland. I saw it again and again on Cape Cod. Finally I just went for it and I am so pleased. You can probably tell I’m not a reader of a lot of nonfiction, and that is my loss. Tara was one of seven children brought up in the Idaho mountains. No one knew these children existed, there were no birth certificates, they were born at home. There were no medical records, they did not go to school. They were brought up by survivalist parents who were preparing for the world to fail. They hauled wood and canned fruit and vegetables. This is a coming of age story about family loyalty, the power of education and the ability to change one’s life. And this is being made into a movie also....but don’t wait, read the book.



Lastly, “**The Great Alone**” by Kristin Hannah. A troubled former POW father makes an impulsive decision to move to a remote corner of Alaska with his wife and daughter. Why they went amazes me (I have to keep remembering it’s a story). Leni, the 13 year old daughter is caught in the middle of her parents, their relationships and their decisions. The cast of characters in this isolated village, and their stories, are well described. There are the pioneers, the misplaced and the entrepreneurs. This is a survivor story, a story of the beauty and dangers of Alaska. Get ready, you will be up all night reading this one.

NATURE at OCEAN RESORTS by Linda Smolarek

Frigates - "Elegance in the sky". When you look up in the sky over the ocean and see a thin black bird with V-cocked wings and a long tail, you are catching a glimpse of a Magnificent Frigatebird. This black pterodactyl-like bird soars effortlessly on tropical breezes with hardly a flap, using its deeply forked tail to steer. These large, dark seabirds have the longest wingspan, in proportion to weight, of all birds. Seafarers

named these aerial predators for a swift warship. The male is glossy black with a throat pouch that becomes bright red when inflated in courtship display. The female is blackish-brown, with white center under parts.

Frigatebirds skim the sea, snatching up food from the surface. They breed on Marquesas Key off the coast of Key West. Ocean Resort is at the northern most part of their year-round range, generally a tropical bird. They are the pirates of the seas stealing food from other birds in midair. They tend to take flight later in the afternoon when winds and thermals are greatest, helping keep them aloft. The Frigatebirds spend most of their life flying effortlessly over the ocean. It rarely lands on the water even though it has webbed feet, because unlike other seabirds it lacks waterproof feathers.

Watching a Magnificent Frigatebird float in the air truly is, as the name implies, magnificent.

They will be able to make meals for short-term illnesses or hospitalizations, give rides to medical appointments, provide respite care for caregivers, be walking/biking buddies for rehab, do small lawn care or inside repair assistance, and take people to get groceries. This is what our community is all about - helping each other!!
