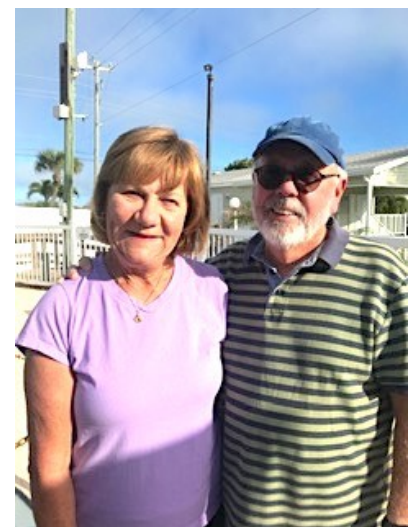

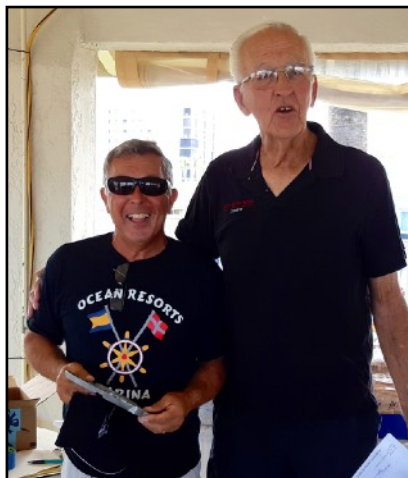
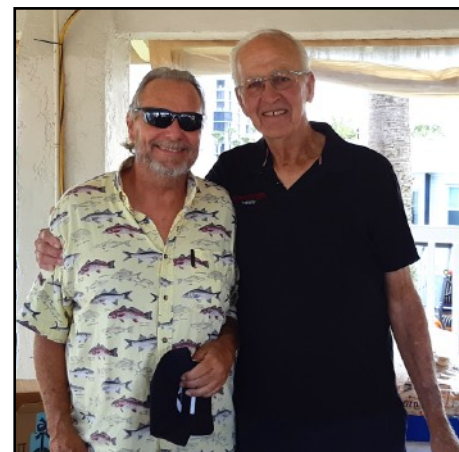

Hello all - I hope everyone is doing well. Season is surely flying by and it has been a busy one for sure. April is creeping upon us. I remind everyone as they are departing to please ensure your homes are ready for hurricane season and that everything is properly secured according to our Rules and Regulations. Please make sure you also stop by the office before departing for the season so we can update your address and file.

As most of you know, the clubhouse remains closed due to construction. There has been a few hiccups through the process that has caused us to get additional engineering done and wait on the change in plans permit. This has been completed and the crews have resumed working. I thank everyone for their

patience during this process. I must say all committees have done a fantastic job making events happen and thinking outside of the box during this process. Once the project is complete, I will send photos out in the blast email and have Barbara Goodman post some on the website for you all who are heading back home to see.

Just a few updates on the pool. With the changes in the maintenance department we've had to hire a pool company until we get the new staff CPO certified. During the first week of testing our pool and chemical levels, they notified me that we had a phosphate issue. We are in the process of treating the phosphates. If you happen to notice cloudy areas or yellowish algae this is part of the treatment process. We also had our new pool pump and motor installed last week. Because the new pump is working at full throttle, it will be trial and error to find the pools happy medium. But rest assured the pool company will be here daily if need be. Our maintenance staff also tests the pool levels daily.

If you haven't had your golf cart inspected please do so, we can inspect your golf cart anytime during office business hours. We have over 75 golf carts on file with expired insurance, with many other golf carts throughout the park that are not on file with the office.

Garbage pick-up is back to its normal schedule. The trash truck has certainly been a challenge for all, especially the mechanics. Please ensure all trash is placed curbside in a container with a lid per the Rules and Regulations. Please don't put trash curbside in a garbage bag, as the critters tend to get into it and it gets strewn everywhere causing our volunteers to have to take additional time to ensure it is all cleaned up. Also, recyclables must be in a covered container; any recyclables in plastic bags will not be picked up as plastic bags are prohibited. Joe Harding and all the garbage volunteers are a big part of the daily routine here at Ocean Resorts, I thank you all tremendously for all of your hard work and dedication this season.

Pet owners please remember it is your responsibility to clean up your after your pet.

There have been several complaints of dog poop not being cleaned up. Dogs are not supposed to be walked in the storage area, and I myself have recently stepped in a large pile of dog poop down there. There are dog stations throughout the park - please use them. It is also the owners responsibility to maintain positive control of your pet and they are to be on a leash of 6 feet or less at all times when outside.

A friendly reminder that if you have a complaint or concern, please come to the office and file a complaint form. I ask that you do not go to the maintenance staff with any complaints or concerns so that they can be handled in the appropriate manner.

It's **Food Drive** time again – between now and mid-May, when the mail carriers will hold their *Stamp Out Hunger* Drive. Ocean Resorts typically sends a LOT of food to the food bank. Let's do it again.

If you have excess NON-PERISHABLE, UNBREAKABLE food items, you may leave them in the collection box in our post office building anytime between now and May. We will package and store the food as it comes in. In May (Mother's Day weekend), our mail carriers will transport all of it to the Treasure Coast Food Bank, which supplies food to St Lucie, Indian River, Martin, and Okeechobee counties.

Check out your pantries. There might be packaged foods that are perfectly good but will have passed their "use by" dates when you return. Why not donate them to feed the less fortunate?

Since the food will be stored in a non-climate-controlled area, please wrap in plastic anything that insects might get into. And please, no carbonated soda – that tends to go "boom" in the heat. (One year that even happened inside the post office, when the air conditioning was on the fritz.)

And while you're in the post office, remember to check the "discards" box, where you will find an ever-changing collection of books we must discard (sometimes because they are tattered, but often just because they are duplicates for which we have no room). Take one to read on your way north this spring. Then you may discard it or pass it on again. Happy Reading!

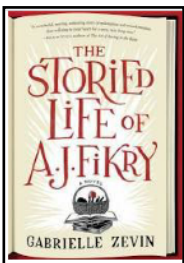

NATURE AT OCEAN RESORTS - The Spinner Shark

Take a walk on our beach and enjoy the acrobatics of the spinner sharks. In one hour, over forty were counted leaping and spinning less than a quarter mile from shore.

The spinner shark is a species of requiem shark with a pointed snout, and black-marked fins. They are migratory seeking warm waters and bear live young. The reason for their "spinning" or spiral motion is the way in which they catch their prey. Climbing quickly within a shoal of fish, they snap on all sides while turning. On average, these large and slender sharks weigh 123 pounds and are 6.6 feet long.

According to the International Shark Attack File, there are no reports on accidents with spinner sharks due to the fact their small narrow teeth are better suited to feeding on small fishes, not attacking large prey. The females bear litters of three to 20 young every other year usually in the spring and early summer. The newborns live in shallow nursery areas near the coast and grow relatively fast. They have been assessed as Near Threatened worldwide and Vulnerable off the southeastern United States.
