Manager's Report by Donna Perez, CAM

I hope everyone is doing well. Hopefully no one was impacted by Hurricane Florence and if you were, I hope you sustained minimal damage. We have certainly been lucky here in Florida this hurricane season.

It has been a busy summer at Ocean Resorts. The Marina had new decking put in and all the lighting fixed. The Bocce courts have been rebuilt and have new benches. The elevators have been repaired and are fully operational. The comfort stations are in the process of being painted and freshened up.

As most of you know, the clubhouse is currently closed due to moisture issues. The Board has voted to have the repairs for the clubhouse, retaining wall, and decking completed by Dunlop Construction. There have been a lot of questions and concerns over the use of the areas for season. The pavilion and pool will remain open during the entire project, and we will do the best we can to help any committees schedule activities in the game room or pavilion area. This is a huge project and it will take a lot of patience from all of us.

We have two new employees: Laurie Lukos has joined us as an Administrative Assistant and Randy Sparks has joined our Maintenance Team. They have both been a great asset to our team. For those of you not here, I encourage you to take the time to introduce yourself to the two of them when you get back home.

Phase 2 security has begun. The game room is complete along with the bathroom doors at the clubhouse. We have put the pool gates and clubhouse doors on hold until the construction on the deck and clubhouse is completed.

Just a few reminders, please be considerate of your neighbors. Quiet hours are between 10pm and 7am. Pets are to be on a leash of 6 feet or less at all times when outside and are not permitted in common area buildings unless they are a service animal. The speed limit in the park is 10 mph at all times.

If anyone would like to be added to my blast email contact list, either call the office or send us an email and we will add you so you will receive future blast emails. We are still in Hurricane season so please abide by By-Law 11.3.i Tie Downs. The end of season is typically the busiest time for tropical storms and hurricanes to develop so please ensure that all your items are properly stored.

I look forward to seeing everyone again as season is quickly approaching. Safe travels back to the Florida for all who are traveling.

Board President's Report October 1, 2018

Shareholders are beginning to trickle back to Ocean Resorts and soon there will be an outpouring getting settled in for the winter, renewing old friendships and creating new ones.

It has been a busy summer and many projects have been implemented (see report by Manager Donna Perez). The Board has met every month during the summer to conduct on-going business. The new video conference system is working well and more shareholders are using it each month. It has been a valuable mechanism for the Board. The marina project was completed, and we give special thanks and appreciation to Ferdie Bruckler, Dockmaster, for his valuable oversight of the project. A trial trash disposal system has begun and is working out well for most. We look forward to seeing how it meets the needs of all. We realize some people will need assistance in disposing of trash and will be setting up a volunteer list for neighbors to help neighbors. Some are already doing so, along with the maintenance staff. Our reserve study has been finalized and there are many items that the Board will be examining in the next few months.

For those who may not have heard, we are facing a major project with repairs of the retaining wall, rotting decks and floors of the clubhouse. The contract has been signed, and the contractor is in the process of getting everything necessary for permits before work can begin. The swimming pool and pavilion will remain open for the duration, but, unfortunately, the clubhouse will continue to be

closed for four to five months during this project. We apologize for the major inconvenience this is going to cause for all social activities, board meetings, and other uses, but there is absolutely no way around it. We will work with management to do what can be done, but we understand this is going to be a huge deterrent to many activities. Additionally, there are not enough funds earmarked for this project in our reserve budget and it is going to require a special assessment. We are continuing to work out the details for this and more information will be available at future Board Meetings.

There will be inconveniences and glitches with anything undertaken. Many things are totally out of our control, but we will need to be flexible and accepting of changes. We ask for your understanding and cooperation throughout all these processes.

The Board looks forward to another year of accomplishments as we strive to make OR the best it can be for all shareholders.







We discovered a great local place hiding in the former Outback Steakhouse location. The Green Marlin Restaurant and Raw Bar serves primarily seafood but also has delicious hamburgers. They have a daily Happy Hour in the bar area that includes a choice of appetizers at \$5 each and, of course, well drinks. The staff is very friendly and efficient. On our first visit, we both had delicious fresh fish served on a bed of sautéed spinach, Fish in the Weeds. We tried the Happy Hour on the next visit. Our bill was \$38 for 4 appetizers and 4 drinks. Everyone around us was friendly and conversing so it felt very welcoming. On our next visit, we tried their hamburgers, which are listed on a special menu. I had my favorite, mushrooms, onions and Swiss cheese, and Tom had his standard cheddar cheeseburger. The burgers were juicy and properly cooked. The Green Marlin is a wonderful addition to the food scene in Vero Beach.

Trash and Recycling

A new trash and recycling system was approved at the August 16 meeting by the Board of Directors on a three-month trial basis. Effective September 1, 2018, curbside trash was suspended. Three front load dumpsters are located in the storage area. Two of these dumpsters will be for trash and the third for recycling. Brush will be picked up by Coast to Coast every other Friday from your lot beginning on September 7, 2018.

All shareholders will be required to take their trash and recyclables to the dumpsters. If it is an extreme hardship for you to take your trash to the dumpsters in the storage area, and you are not able to arrange for a friend or neighbor to do so, please call the office to make alternative arrangements. If you should have any questions regarding the matter, please feel free to contact the office.
